I came to know Wendi upon receiving her application to join the Women's Advisory Committee for Support Staff (WACSS) in May of 2015. This is a very active committee that works towards the betterment of women support staff at MSU. Wendi works in Detroit at the College of Osteopathic Medicine and WACSS had been working very hard to recruit members that would provide insight to the needs of those that work outside of MSU's East Lansing campus. Since joining, Wendi has provided such energy and vigor to the committee and drives to East Lansing to attend most (if not all) monthly committee meetings in person. She represents the views of those 'off-campus' competently and provides understanding and awareness of their needs. In her very first year, Wendi volunteered to facilitate the annual spring forum attended by over 350 women. Unbeknownst to her, this is a timeintensive responsibility that she led with such determination and dedication. Wendi was responsible for organizing all aspects of the forum from attendee registration, speakers, flow, food, layout, tasks, and prize giveaways. On the day of our annual spring forum, her son, Cassius Winston (MSU MBB point guard), was receiving the 2016 Mr. Basketball award. Wendi attended to her tasks as lead of the spring forum vs. being present when her son was given this prestigious award - I could not give any better example of her dedication towards work other than that! In Wendi's second year, she served as WACSS Secretary taking minutes for every meeting and once again volunteered to facilitate the spring forum for the second year in a row! As an **innovative thinker**, she facilitated a more organized way of distributing giveways to lucky attendees by duplicating name tags that would be placed in a bucket to be selected during registration. She also worked to ensure that employees joining via live-stream from all over Michigan were able to participate,

not only as active participants in the actual forum, but also included in the prize giveaways regardless of the fact that they were joining remotely. In addition, she took all feedback received the first year to enhance our programming, helping to achieve a near perfect success rate based on attendee feedback the second time around. From my understanding, and at work, Wendi looks at other's obstacles as opportunities for improvement and works on a daily basis to ensure satisfaction and ease in all that they do.

Knowing that the Gliozzo's recognize and value the importance of an education, I can tell you that Wendi doesn't ever stop learning! She has been a staff member at MSU for eight years, and the field in which she works is constantly changing and renewing. Wendi's significant contributions towards community and public service are broad and extensive. She is an active member of the Base Hospital Task Force and is representative on the Shiffman Medical Library Outreach Advisory Council. She has served on the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) Standard 3 Task Force, revised information for continued compliance with the American Osteopathic Association Commission on COCA, and worked in coordination with several offices including the MSU Libraries, Detroit Medical Center, and Osteopathic Medicine regarding expansion. In addition, she gave a professional presentation in 2011 at the Michigan Library Conference. She holds professional affiliations in the American Library Association, Michigan Library Association, and the Metropolitan Detroit Medical Library Group.

Wendi has continuously showed concern for members of the campus community and reflects diligence in her daily work in all that she does. As a member of WACSS, she is constantly considering how things would be perceived by others and wants to ensure we are inclusive and responsive. She works to ensure that other's voices are heard and considered. For seven years, since 2010, Wendi has also served as a CTU representative. As such, she also attends many (if not all!) of the monthly meetings held on campus and is actively involved in subcommittee work. Did I tell you that she lives and works in Detroit!? Like WACSS, she is very dedicated and active, volunteering to ensure that their annual events are well received and successful. I joined MSUCOM-DMC about two years back as the Administrative Director, and as her supervisor, got to know Wendi really well over time. As a new team member, I immediately realized that Wendi was very approachable, honest and a great team player.
